

We held your AGM on the 25th July postponed from March due to Covid 19. We welcome Geoff Mead to the committee and say thanks to Ian Blackmore for his time on the Committee. The Office Holders remain unchanged.

The Long service and Good Conduct Medal criteria has recently changed. Regular Force only need to complete 14 Years' Service for an award and 7 Years for each Clasp. Ex Service Person's will also qualify. To apply use the application form on the NZDEF Medals Website https://medals.nzdf.mil.nz

The Secretary and I attended the District AGM in Westport in August. The Bi-annual AGM is due to be held in Murchison 7th March 2021.

John D'Rose Rocky Roxburgh and I attended the unveiling of the Memorial Wall (at Founders Heritage Park). It lists the names of the more than 3,700 personnel who signed up for the WW1 from the Nelson Province. It also contains the names of an additional 3,500 men who were called up as Reservists but didn't end up going away. The names of the 684 who died as a direct result of their service have been marked with a cross. It's well worth a visit.

The Christmas Dinner is booked for the 21st November, 2020. Details will be advised shortly.

The Remembrance Sunday Service will be held at the Church on the Hill in Richmond on the 8th November, 2020. Possibly at 10.30 a.m. Details to be finalized. This will be followed by laying a wreath at the Richmond Memorial Gardens, Oxford Street. We will also re dedicate the 75th Anniversary Plaque for Armistice Day. It has been repositioned due to the tree that was planted died due to the drought. This was discussed with the TDC.
